Disabled Person's Travel Pass

You can have a Disabled Person's Travel Pass for the following reasons:

You are partially sighted.

- You are Deaf or you are unable to speak.
- You are unable to walk or have difficulty walking because of a disability.
- You are unable to use both arms, or you don't have any arms.
- You have a Learning Disability.

You are not allowed to drive because of medical reasons. For example, you have epilepsy.



You cannot use your pass on some special bus services, like tour buses or coaches.

How you can use your Disabled Person's Travel Pass on the bus

You can travel for free after 9:30am in the morning during the week, and all day at the weekend and on Bank Holidays.

This is just in West Yorkshire.



You can travel for half-fare on the train in West Yorkshire at these times:

- Mondays to Fridays from 9:30am to
 4:00pm and after 6:30pm
- Anytime at weekends and bank holidays

If you travel before 9:30am, or between 4.00pm and 6:30pm on Mondays to Fridays you have to pay full fare.

If you get a train outside West Yorkshire, you have to pay full fare for the bit of the journey that is outside West Yorkshire.

You can buy tickets at the train station ticket office, or at a ticket machine.

If this is difficult for you because of your disability, you can buy a ticket from the conductor on the train.

You will need to show your Disabled Person's Travel Pass when you buy a ticket.

How you can use your Companion Pass on the bus

If you can't travel on your own, you may be able to get a Companion Pass.



This means that you and someone else can travel for free at off peak times.



Off peak is after 9:30am in the morning and all day at weekends and bank holidays.



You can also get free travel for you and your companion when you get the bus from West Yorkshire to these places:

- York
- North Yorkshire
- South Yorkshire
- East Yorkshire
- Hull
- Manchester



You can also get free travel for you and your companion when you get the bus back to West Yorkshire from these places:

- York
- North Yorkshire
- South Yorkshire
- East Yorkshire
- Hull



If you get the bus back from Manchester to West Yorkshire your companion will have to pay for their bus ticket.



When you travel to other areas your companion will have to pay for their return journey as well as any local travel.



Your companion does not have to be the same person every time you travel.

They can't use the pass if they are not with you.



Blind Person's Travel Pass

You can have a Blind Person's Travel Pass if you live in West Yorkshire and can't see at all or have a lot of difficulty seeing.



You can travel for free on local buses in West Yorkshire at anytime.



You can also travel for free on buses in other areas between 9:30am and 11:00pm Monday to Friday and all day at weekends and Bank Holidays.



You will need to check where and when you can use your pass if you are travelling outside West Yorkshire.



Blind Person's Travel Pass

You can use a Blind Person's Travel Pass to travel for free on the train in West Yorkshire.



If you travel outside West Yorkshire you will have to pay for the part of the journey that is not in West Yorkshire.



You must buy your ticket for the whole journey before you get on the train.

Applying for your Pass



You can apply for a pass online at wymetro.com.

The website tells you what information you need to give when you apply.



If you cannot apply online, contact Metroline to ask about other ways to apply for your pass.

You might need to provide a passport style photograph of yourself.



If you qualify for a pass it will be sent to your home.

Lost Passes



If you lose your pass you will have to pay £5 to get a new one. You don't have to pay for a Blind Person's Travel Pass.



You can get a new pass online at wymetro.com or you can go to a Bus Station Travel Centre.



You will need to take some identification with you e.g. a passport or a letter that has your name and address on it.



Stolen Passes

If your pass has been stolen you need to report it to the police. They will give you a crime reference number.

To contact the police phone 101



You can get a new pass at a Bus Station Travel Centre if you give them the crime reference number.

Damaged Passes





Your Pass will not work if it is damaged as it needs to be scanned by bus ticket machines and rail station gates.

If your pass is damaged or if you look different to your photo then you must get a new Pass.

You can get a new Pass online or at a Bus Station Travel Centre.
